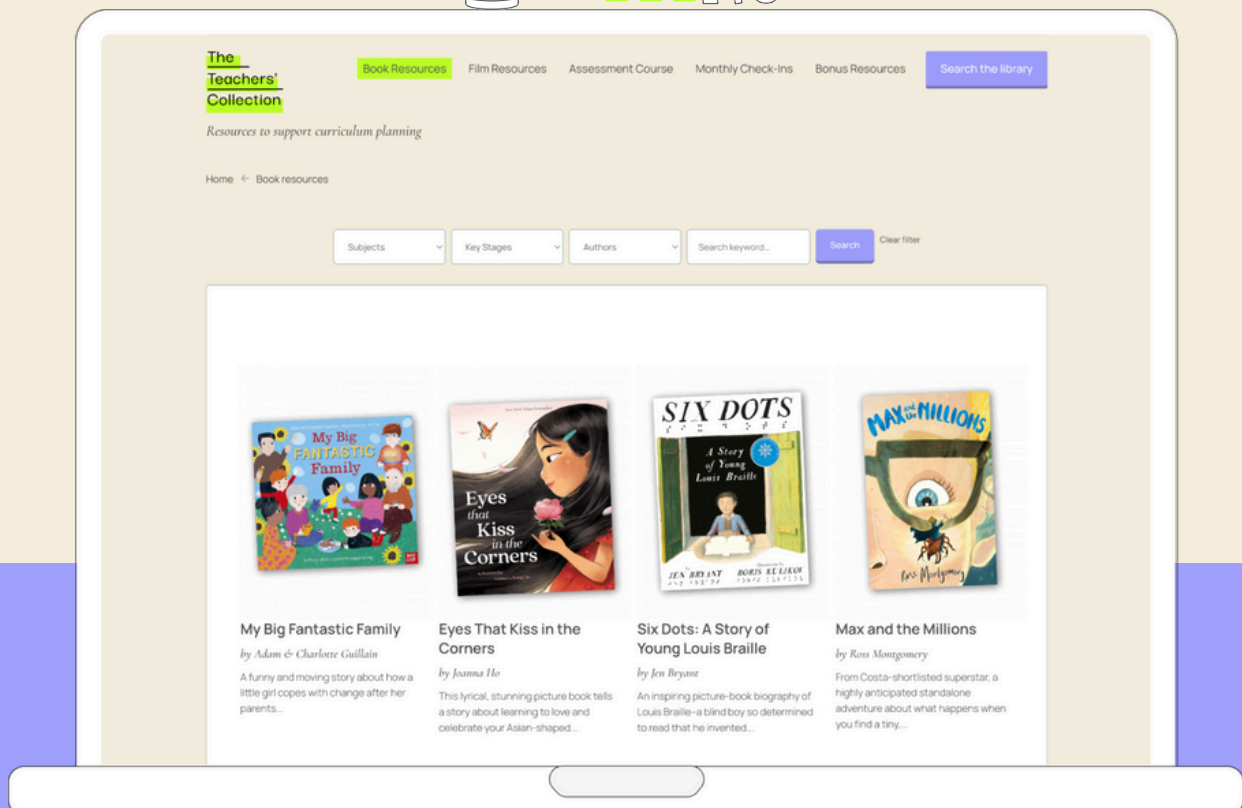
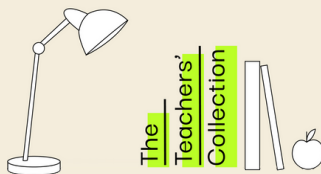

Rich in vocabulary

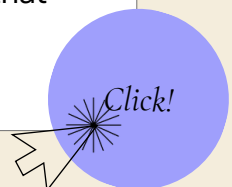
There is wide ranging research that shows the positive impact of reading demanding texts with your class. Mary has done a summary of [the research here](#) in a short 10-minute video.

In this document we will take you through the website and all the resources that it has to offer to breathe new life into your classroom.

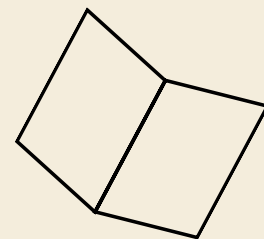

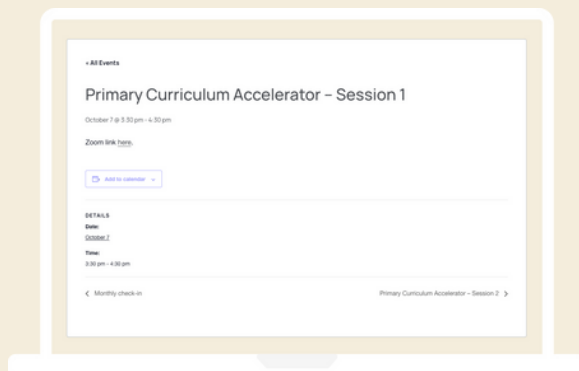
These check-ins are held every half-term with Mary Myatt for all paid subscribers to The Teachers' Collection.

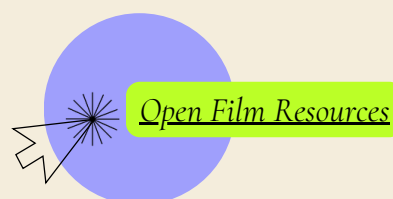


This is a growing library of recordings with colleagues. The aim is to provide:

The library is being developed all the time and we look forward to updating you when we have perfected categorising and organising the films. In the meantime, you can find them [here](#) to browse through.



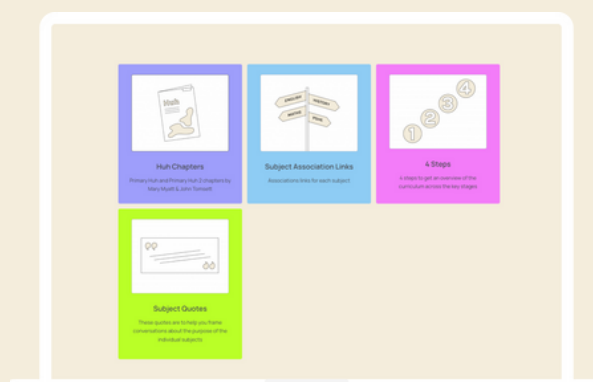

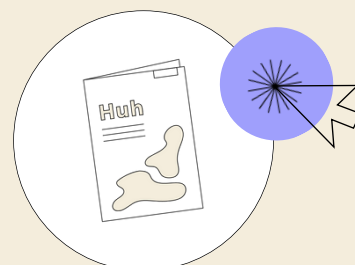

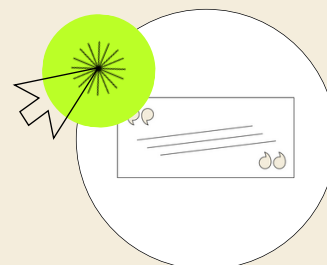
Huh Chapters

Chapters from Primary Huh series of books. These are available to read and download. They cover subjects and areas within a primary setting.



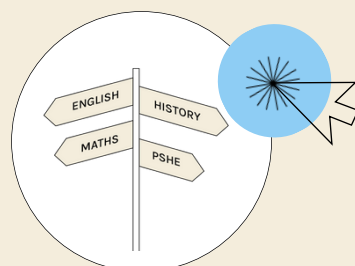
Subject Quotes

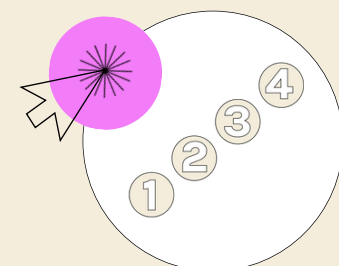

An overview of the curriculum across key stages.

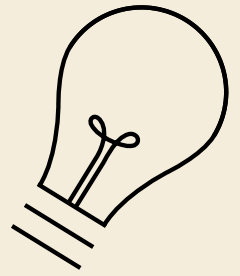

Logging in

You can [log in](#) with either your email and password or alternatively you can use the passwordless option – this means that you enter your email that your account is registered with and a one-time password link is emailed to you to click on.

Subscriptions - How they work

- The Teachers' Collection is set up with a whole school subscription – for all staff
- The subscription tier is defined by the number of pupils on roll

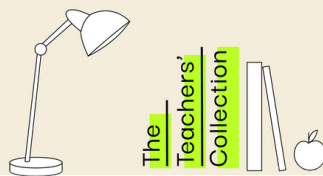

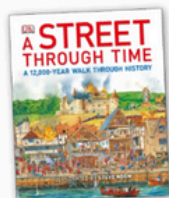

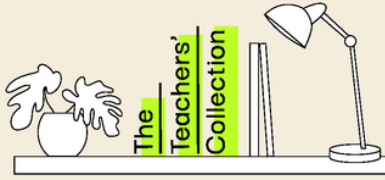
